






Lester L. Laminack



Lester is now a full-time writer and consultant working with schools throughout the United States and abroad. He is an active member of the National Council of Teachers of English and served as co-editor of the NCTE journal Primary Voices and as editor of the Children's Book Review Department of the NCTE journal Language Arts. He also served as a teaching editor for the magazine Teaching K-8 and wrote the Parent Connection column (2000-2002). He served as the Basic Reading Consultant to Literacy Volunteers of America from 1987 through 2001 and is a former member of the Board of Directors of Our Children's Place and is currently serving on the board of North Carolina Region A Partnership for Children. Lester has served as editor of the Writing Department for the ILA journal Reading Teacher and is the recipient of The Ragan-Rubin Award for outstanding North Carolina writers from the North Carolina English Teachers Association.



BUILDING RESILIENT WRITERS






skills will develop. Learn new ways to support resilient writers by integrating proven techniques and intentional language in writing instruction.



READING RESCUE: ACCELERATING COMPREHENSION WITH THE "FAB FOUR" STRATEGIES

Many of our students struggle with reading comprehension and desperately need a "reading vitamin" boost to catch up! Reciprocal teaching (Palinscar & Brown, 1986), or The Fab Four (Oczkus, 2018) is an evidence-based discussion technique that promises up to 2 years growth- sometimes in just a few months! The robust strategies include predict, question, clarify, and summarize. The "Fab Four" work with any materials at any grade level. Classroom examples include: read alouds with gestures and characters for K-2; a "four door" foldable for intermediate students to guide discussions; interactive chart examples for K-12; and rotating role cards for upper grade lessons. Project schools in Australia, Ohio, and California experienced post pandemic growth with the Fab Four. In Paradise, California where a fire destroyed the town, students jumped from 32% reading on grade level to 62% in one year! Lori's work is endorsed by leading researchers including John Hattie, who wrote the foreword to her book, Reciprocal Teaching at Work (ASCD, 2018) Come see what all the excitement is about and leave with dozens of fresh ideas!

WRITING: THE MISSING MIDDLE PIECE: PRACTICAL LESSONS, POWERFUL RESULTS!

How can you help student develop proficient writing skills and confidence? Guided writing is a FUN and active lesson step that falls between teacher modeling and student independent writing.

After teacher modeling, students work in teams to write using "cool tools" in a brief structured collaborative writing assignment. Cool tools include colored sentence strips, sticky notes, or even giant pieces of paper. Picture these classroom examples; first graders each write one line on a sticky note for a poem about tarantulas; third graders write on sentence strips and share one reason their "superhero" is the best and collaborate with a team to write persuasive paragraphs; sixth grade students write sentences on strips for paragraphs about the

Titanic and combine them for a class report. Come see dozens of fabulous examples from narrative, expository, and persuasive writing as well as poetry. Guided writing is a step you can incorporate tomorrow with little prep to dramatically improve writing across your classroom and school!


Bethune's legacy. He shares her impact below:







IGNITE A PASSION FOR LITERACY

Are you interested in helping your students foster a love for learning through literacy? Learn how to ignite that passion through favorite classroom activities, resources, and routines that will help you develop a positive classroom community that promotes student engagement and learning through books! We will talk about how to create a classroom culture that is supportive of student choice, model how to talk about books, and explore successful ways to bring reading into your classroom. This session is for both classroom teachers and administrators hoping to support their teachers in the literacy journey.

As an educator who loves reading, a large part of my journey as an educator has been to help as many students as I can fall in love with reading and discover their "why" for being readers in and out of the classroom. 
LEADERS AND THINKERS: USING BIOGRAPHIES TO CHALLENGE AND INSPIRE

Gain a fresh perspective on using biographies in your classroom! Explore a diverse array of books on inspiring leaders from all over the world, and empower your students to think critically about heroes and villains. You'll walk away from this session with new ideas for non-fiction writing projects, and strategies to inspire your students to be the next generation of leaders and thinkers.

I will use my book, *Leaders and Thinkers* in American History, as a guide to kick off our session. We will learn about some of the lesser-known figures in American history and discuss ways in which their stories can inspire our students to take on leadership roles in their own lives. Because representation in biographies is SO important, I will also provide dozens of book recommendations for different ages and reading levels. Attendees will then research an inspiring leader of their choice.

Biographies are especially inspiring because we are able to see a piece of ourselves in the leaders that we admire. It is imperative to include extensive representation in biography units in order to ensure that all of our students see aspects of their own identity represented. This session will include diverse resources for teachers, and will include strategies for culturally and historically responsive teaching.
